***Minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting
St. Jude's Episcopal Church
Niceville, Florida 32578
November 14, 2021***

At 11:50 AM, Pastor Handlee Vige, Priest-in-Charge, called the 2021 Annual Meeting to order. He then opened with a prayer asking specifically for blessing and guidance for members as they participate in the annual meeting of the parish.

The first order of business was to elect a Secretary for the meeting. Pastor Vige nominated Debra Kosche. There being no other nominees from the floor, a motion was made to close the nominations. It was seconded and unanimously passed. She was duly elected by a vote of those in attendance. Pastor Vige appointed Jerry Fowler to serve as Parliamentarian. After allowing time for the attendees to review the minutes from the 2020 Annual Meeting, a motion was made and seconded to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion was unanimously passed with no further discussion.

The next order of business was to elect three new vestry members who will each serve a three-year term. The following people were nominated from the floor: Patrick Flynt, Brenda Huntley, and Sally Yancey. There being no other nominations from the floor, those nominated were duly elected by acclamation.

In addition to electing vestry members, the parish also needed to elect three delegates to represent St. Jude's at the 2022 Diocesan Convention. The following people were nominated from the floor: Dottie Doherty, Patrick Flynt, Brenda Huntley, and Charlie Yancey. There being no additional nominations, nominations were closed. Direction was given to vote for three names, with the person receiving the least number of votes being elected to serve as an alternate delegate. The following people were elected to serve as delegates: Dottie Doherty, Brenda Huntley, and Charlie Yancey; Patrick Flynt was elected as an alternate delegate.

Pastor Vige then referred those in attendance to the Annual Report booklet in which reports were submitted by committee and ministry heads and opened the floor to any who would like to say a few words about 2021 or what's to come in 2022. Parish committee and ministry reports were presented in person or by title.

In closing, Pastor Vige thanked those in attendance, saying it has been his privilege to serve at St. Jude's, and he is looking forward to the future. There being no further parish business, he closed the meeting with a prayer, adjourning at 12:45 PM.

We come together as a team monthly to discuss past, current, and future events and to discuss the safety and spiritual health of our youth to determine how best to support them in their continued growth. Though we have been battling the same challenges of our congregation (health risks, congregation size, rector search process etc.), we reflect on the many blessings that God has provided through our church family's children.

2022 Annual Report Men's Group

The Men's Bible and Religious-Studies Group meets both in person and via Zoom Wednesday mornings at 07:30 - 08:30. Please join us in some "spirited discussion"! Additionally, each month we host a Fellowship Breakfast to assist in not only bringing ourselves together in Christ, but to welcome others in our community to know us and our Church (First Time Breakfast Visitors are FREE!). So please invite someone from your neighborhood, someone you know at work, or somebody that you might just meet – for as Doug Dillon and Kathryn Perez said: "Coincidences link us to the unknown and weave us into it." "We don't meet people by accident. They're meant to cross our path for a reason." Proceeds (donations) from these breakfasts provide support not only to our church, our youth, and our programs, but also to our community outreach and beyond. Treasurer’s Report 2022

Again this year, I want to thank the people who make it possible for me to act as your treasurer by keeping up with the everyday tasks that make the financial aspect of the church run smoothly. We are blessed to have Anna Wells, our faithful Office Manager, and our new bookkeeper David Williams to keep-up with the weekly details. Also, I would be remiss if I didn’t thank our faithful counters Cathy Self and Cathy White who accurately account for weekly donations. THANK-YOU!!

As of the end of October, our financial position shows that we have a **net gain for the year of \$45,959**. Our income for the year through October was \$253,639 and expenses were \$207,680. Our monthly expenses (salaries, insurance, utilities, and the building upkeep as shown below) are \$20,768. Below is a summary of our average expenses for 2022:

What did we study:

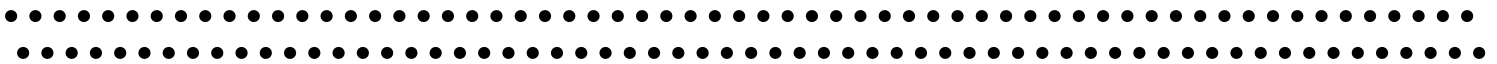
- The Good Book Club study of Exodus during the seasons of Epiphany and Lent

The Welcome and Newcomer's Committee

Our ministry provides volunteers to greet and assist visitors and parishioners every Sunday morning during church services. We invite visitors to sign the church guest book or fill out a visitor pew card.

Ministry members send visitors welcome notes and deliver welcome "St. Jude's Mug" bags. The bags include a St. Jude's coffee mug, an invitation to our monthly fellowship breakfast, a copy of the current edition of the newsletter, and literature about our church. We also coordinate with Anna Wells, the church administrator, to provide name tags for newcomers to St. Jude's.

Following the two challenging years of the 2020-2021 COVID-19 pandemic, this year St. Jude's attendance at the weekly worship services significantly increased. In 2022 our committee members identified and welcomed 48 individuals who visited St. Jude's. Of these visitors, 32 are now attending church services on a regular basis. Four of our newcomers were received or reaffirmed in the Episcopal Church when Bishop Kendrick visited St. Jude's in October 2022.

Since January 2022, weekly attendance at the two worship services on Sunday, children's Sunday school, and nursery has increased to 59-124 people. This count includes people who check-in while attending the service via the livestreamed broadcast on Facebook. During the same period last year, weekly attendance was 50-75 people.

Special thanks to the Communications/Audiovisual team, Michelle Crawford, Patrick Flynt, Ken Copeland, Tarquin Hughes and Debra Kosche, for the outstanding job they have done this year livestreaming the Sunday worship services and welcoming and communicating with viewers in the Facebook Live comments.

Outreach

Many thanks to our parishioners for their support of outreach programs during the past year. In addition to outreach projects organized by the parish Men's Group, the Sewing Guild, and children and youth groups, we supported the following programs:

Weekly food donations to Sharing and Caring organized by Gloria and Gary Witkos

In coordination with the Niceville food distribution program at Crosspoint, we provided volunteers to unload delivery trucks and repack food supplies for distribution on a monthly basis.

We supported the Opportunity Place homeless shelter with funding for meals for 40 people once a month.

Michelle Crawford organized fund raisers for Episcopal Relief and Development (ERD) disaster relief fund which supported Ukrainian refugee support and hurricane disaster relief in the US.

The annual United Thank Offering (UTO) program was also supported thanks to Dottie Doherty.

Stewardship Report for the Year 2023

The status of this year’s pledge campaign as of November 17 is as follows:

In October, Eric Kosche sent out 103 letters to all St. Jude’s families asking them to consider a financial pledge to St. Jude’s. Pledging gives the Finance Committee a realistic tool in developing our 2023 budget.

We have received 49 pledges totaling \$264,820 – that is an average of \$5,404.

Of the 49 pledges, 24 families increased their pledge while 13 pledges remained the same. We had 6 new pledging families and 6 pledges decreased.

Our goal is to have a funded budget of \$408,000 with 60 pledging families. This budget will provide the necessary resources to operate our church with a full-time Rector for the year 2023.

The Finance Committee will be working on the 2023 budget through December, so please, if you are planning to support St. Jude’s financially, please send, or use our on-line feature on the web site, or bring your pledge card to the church.
