### Minutes of the 2021 Annual Meeting St. Jude's Episcopal Church Niceville, Florida 32578 December 4, 2022

At 10:50 am, Cathy Shea, Senior Warden, called the 2022 Annual Meeting to order. She then opened with a prayer. The first order of business was to elect a secretary for the meeting. Cathy nominated Heidi Morgan. There being no other nominees from the floor, a motion was made to close the nomination. It was seconded and unanimously passed. She was duly elected by a vote of those in attendance. Cathy Shea appointed Jerry Fowler to serve as Parliamentarian. After allowing time for attendees to review the minutes from the 2021 Annual Meeting, a motion was made by Jerry White and seconded by Debra Kosche to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion was unanimously passed with no further discussion.

The next order or business was to elect three new vestry members who will each serve a three-year term. The following people were presented as nominees who had volunteered for the three open positions: Terry Griffin, Justin Snyder, and Jane McCarty. Additional nominations were opened up to the floor. There being no other nominations from the floor, those nominated were duly elected by acclamation.

In addition to electing vestry members, the parish also needed to elect three delegates to represent St. Jude's at the 2023 Diocesan Convention. The following people were nominated from the floor: Gloria Witkos, Peggy Griffin, and Lynn Smith. There being no additional nominations, nominations were duly elected by acclamation. Cathy asked if anyone would be willing to be an alternate delegate, in case something happened to one of the delegates, and Terry Griffin agreed to be 1<sup>st</sup> alternate, and Dottie Doherty agreed to be 2<sup>nd</sup> alternate.

Cathy then referred those in attendance to the Annual Report booklet in which reports were submitted by committee and ministry heads and opened the floor to any who would like to say a few words about 2022 or what's to come in 2023. Parish committee and ministry reports were presented in person or by title.

Cathy thanked those in attendance. She also welcomed and reaffirmed our new members, especially those in attendance.

Jerry Fowler asked if he could speak. He said we needed a motion to approve the nominations for vestry and the delegates to convention. He also thanked Cathy for the great job and leadership she has provided to St. Jude's during our two long years of searching for a new rector, even while dealing with her health issues.

A motion was made by Joe Morgan and seconded by Debra Kosche to approve the nominees to the vestry and the delegates to Convention as discussed. The motion was unanimously passed with no further discussion.

There being no further parish business, Cathy closed the meeting by asking everyone stand, hold hands, and say the Lord's prayer together. The meeting was adjourned at 11:43.

#### **Upcoming Needs/Things to be aware of:**

We did have issues with the wells, pumps and sprinklers, and have made great strides in that area – but still have some things to do, (re-lay a portion of the sidewalk zone, adjust sprinklers, mark zones).

Our freezer is showing its age, and while repaired, still needs to be monitored.

One of our Sanctuary 'new' HVAC units is still awaiting parts to repair, but luckily, our old unit has been able to keep up.

Still need to re-caulk around chapel window framing, and install sun-shade.

#### The 2024 Stewardship

The St. Jude's Children and Youth Ministry team has been very busy this year. In 2023, we've welcomed a new Youth Director and several new families with children who participate in Sunday school and youth events. We come together as a team monthly to discuss past, current, and future events. The safety and spiritual well-being of St. Jude's youth is our top priority as we determine how to best support them in their continued growth.

<u>Nursery</u>: We are blessed to have Amy LeFrenier- our loving nursery caretaker. Parents and children alike look forward to seeing Amy on Sunday mornings. We thank those who volunteer as the 2<sup>nd</sup> person in the nursery - your time is very much appreciated.

<u>Sunday School</u>: Our Sunday school program is blessed to have welcomed several new children to the program this year. The spiritual needs of our children are at the forefront of our Christian Education program. We kindly thank Brenda Huntley, Angela Diggs, Christina Hutson, and all others who have volunteered for their time and dedication.

Middle/High School Youth Program: Our youth program has welcomed a new youth director, Samantha Richard, and several families with middle and/or high school-aged children. The youth program had many events this year- a chili cook-off, pancake supper, coastal life sculpture program with St. Simon's, Easter egg dying and egg hunt, family day at Urban Air Adventure and Trampoline Park, Mother's Day Sunday, VBS, blessing of the backpacks, adoption event with Pet Welfare, nature walk at Turkey Creek, and events held in the youth classroom that center around faith and fellowship. In the coming weeks, the youth program will be participating in the gingerbread competition and telling of the nativity story.

<u>Safety:</u> The Children and Youth team takes safety very seriously and we follow the guidelines of the Episcopal church; Safeguarding God's Children. #### Treasurer's Report 2023

Again this year, I want to thank the people who make it possible for me to act as your treasurer by keeping up with the everyday tasks that make the financial aspect of the church run smoothly. We are blessed to have Anna Wells, our faithful Office Manager; and our bookkeeper, David Williams, to keep up with the weekly details. And I would be remiss if I didn't thank our faithful counters, Cathy Self and Cathy White who make sure the weekly donations are accounted for properly – every week. THANK-YOU!!

As of the end of October our financial position shows that we have a **net loss for the year of \$1487.** Our income for the year through October was \$342,966 and expenses were \$344,453. Our monthly expenses (salaries, insurance, utilities and the building upkeep as shown below) are \$34,453. Here is a summary of our average expenses for 2023:

# **Music Director's report 2023**

Music is integral to our worship at St. Jude's, and it is an honor and pleasure to be working as music director at this wonderful church as we seek to glorify God together.

Since August 1, my official start date, work has been done to:

- grow the choir and incorporate anthems into the 10:30 service
- continue to incorporate children and youth into musical worship participation
- incorporate skilled congregation members as instrumentalists
- bring in occasional professional singers to enhance worship
- reconfigure the music area in the sanctuary
- work closely with the rector in worship planning
- increase the use of the organ in worship.

Goals for the future include

- continuing to grow the choir and its participation in worship
- encouraging and welcoming congregation members of all ages into musical activities in worship
- exhibiting good stewardship of the church's instruments, including considering and planning for eventual replacement of the aging keyboard and piano
- working to establish more singing opportunities for children and youth
- seeking to serve God and the church with our hearts and minds.

I am grateful for all who are now involved and am looking forward to continuing to grow the music program. Especially I thank Fr. Blake Hutson for his support and collegiality.
