May 20th - Ms Carla Crowder - Alabama Appleseed Center for Law & Justice

Ms. Crowder is the Executive Director of Alabama Appleseed and brings more than two decades of experience, both as a journalist and an attorney, in public policy research, advocacy, and litigation on behalf of marginalized and vulnerable communities. As a journalist covering the criminal justice system, she worked at four newspapers in three states and was twice nominated for a Pulitzer Prize. She directs the organization's policy advocacy agenda centered on the intersection of poverty and the criminal justice system. Appleseed's campaigns challenge policing for profit, laws that needlessly ensnare Alabamians in jails and prisons, and a court system funded on the backs of the poor.

She is the Faith in Community Coordinator for Greater Birmingham Ministries (GBM), a 50 year old direct services and social justice organization, where she engages with GBM's twenty interfaith sponsoring congregations. She is a leader of the Alabama Poor People's Campaign: A National Call for Moral Revival, a movement that continues the work of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. and works to dismantle the unjust systems of racism, poverty, ecological devastation and the war economy which adversely impact poor and low-income people.
