

# End-of-Life Checklist

## Healthcare – Medical

✓	<b>Start Your Plan</b>
	<b>Healthcare Power of Attorney</b> Name a trusted person to make healthcare decisions on your behalf
	<b>Living Will</b> Share your end-of-life medical wishes (prolong life, intubation, etc.)
	<b>POLST or MOLST</b> Physician’s Order for Life-Sustaining Treatment (optional)
	<b>Designation of Guardian</b> A legal guardian for healthcare purposes
	<b>Organ or Tissue Donation</b>
	<b>Medical Information</b> A clear outline of your providers, wishes, and medical records

## Financial—Legal

	<b>Long-Term Health Resources</b> Ensure you have a plan to pay for long-term care
	<b>Durable Financial Power of Attorney</b> If you’re unable to manage your money, who acts on your behalf?
	<b>A Will or Trust</b> A legal document used to transfer your property to beneficiaries
	<b>Location of Documents</b> Share you document easily with loved ones
	<b>Contact Information</b> For doctors, attorneys, etc.
	<b>Assets and Debts</b> Your assets and debts fall to your estate and beneficiaries
	<b>Dependents</b> Plan for minor children, pets, or any other dependents

## Digital Legacy

	<b>Email Accounts</b> What do you want to happen to your email accounts?
	<b>Digital Account Access</b> Share passwords to any accounts you want loved ones to take over
	<b>Photos and Files</b> Your photos tell your story. How do you want these shared (if at all)?
	<b>Social Media Accounts</b> You can memorialize social pages, delete them, or leave them as-is
	<b>Digital Assets</b> Crypto, gaming accounts, and more might be a part of your estate
	<b>Inventory of Your Accounts and Digital Assets</b> Make a clear digital inventory of your accounts and digital assets
	Delete Unused Accounts Get in the habit of deleting any unused accounts to protect your data.

	<b>Physical Marker</b>

## Funeral Plan

	<b>Funeral Details</b>
	<b>Burial, Cremation, or Donation</b>
	<b>Casket or Urn</b>
	<b>Funeral Gifts</b> While flowers are traditional, you could choose a donation, book, etc.
	<b>Location</b>
	<b>Funeral Mood</b>
	<b>Planners and Speakers</b>
	<b>Payment Arrangements</b> Consider pre-payment or making a budget; and if you’ve prepaid, let your loved ones know the details
